Rules Governing Exhibits & Instructions to Exhibitors

- The primary object of the Show is the improvement of Agriculture and livestock in all branches.
- 2. All stock must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 3. All stock must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least two months previous to date of Show. Confined Classes are for residents of County Westmeath only.
- 4. Pens will be provided for exhibits in all cattle classes. Bulls exhibited at the show must be secured by a ring in the nose, with a strong rope or chain attached. The Society shall have the right to order the removal of any animal that they consider dangerous and shall not be responsible for any injury or damage caused by such animals.
- 5. With regard to cattle, where "pure-bred" stock is mentioned, it is understood that the stock exhibited must be entered in or eligible for entry in the various Herd Books.
- 6. **N.B.** In the case of bulls, the date of birth must be stated on the entry form.
- 7. In all classes for heifers, a "heifer" is classified as a heifer until she has a calf.
- All animals must be shown at owner's risk. The Society will not be accountable for any accident, damage or loss of exhibit.
- 9. The farm and garden produce must have been grown on the exhibitor's land and a declaration to that effect, signed by two respectable householders living in the immediate locality and approved by the Society, may be required from each prize-winner before prizes are paid.
- 10. All stock, produce etc., to be in the Show Yard by **10.00.a.m.** on the morning of the Show.
- Prizes will be awarded in all classes except Pedigree Classes where there is sufficient merit; the Judges will be distinctly instructed to withhold a prize where sufficient merit does not exist.
- 12. All Prizes disallowed or not awarded shall lapse to the Society.
- 13. Objections: All objections to the decision of the Judges must be lodged with the Secretary, in writing, accompanied by a fee of €50.00, not later than one hour after the competition finishes, on the date of the Show. The fee or fees so lodged will be forfeited if the objection or objections is or are considered to be frivolous.
- 14. Entries: The necessary forms AND SCHEDULE can be DOWNLOADED FROM OUR WEBSITE no other forms can be received. All descriptions of stock as to age and breed must be stated when completing entry forms. This is a must, especially in respect of qualifiers and all horse/pony/cattle classes.
- 15. Entries will not be accepted unless accompanied by the requisite entry fee.
- 16. If it is proved to the satisfaction of the Society that the owner or any person in his employment or under his control has been guilty of any violation of the rules or regulations, has made a false statement in the certificate of entry, or has secured an unfair advantage, the exhibitor shall forfeit all prizes awarded him at the Show, together with all fees paid by him, and shall be liable to be excluded from competing at this or any future show of the Society.
- 17. The Society shall reserve the right of declining or returning any exhibit without incurring any liability. In the event of the Society being unable to accept any entry, notice will be given within six days after the final closing of the entries. The fees lodged will be refunded.

- 18. No refund of entry fees in any class, including jumping competitions, will be made in case of entries, which are not sent forward for competition, or which are disqualified from competition for failure to comply with regulations.
- 19. No Steward can officiate in the ring who is an exhibitor in the class under adjudication.
- 20. IMPORTANT NOTICE: All Cattle Exhibitors are asked to pay special attention to the notice "T.B Testing of Animals".
- 21. All exhibits must remain until 4.30.p.m.
- 22. Rosettes Prize colours First Prize RED; Second Prize BLUE; Third Prize YELLOW.
- 23. The award of Rosette or Prize Card does not imply that the entry is entitled to prize money.
- 24. All exhibits must bear their labels otherwise they will be refused by the stewards.
- 25. In the Livestock Section any class for which only one entry is received will be cancelled. IMPORTANT NOTICE: In the Horse and Cattle classes no animal may win more than two first prizes.

NOTE: Anyone found interfering with any exhibit or disarranging any display will be asked to leave the grounds.

SPECIAL NOTICE: All children's ridden show pony classes shall be restricted to Mares and Geldings only. No animal shown in saddle classes shall be under three years of age. Mares with a living foal born current season shall not be shown in Saddle classes.

The Show is run under the Rules and Regulations of The Irish Shows Association and the **Show Jumping Association of Ireland, the I.P.S. and the Side Saddle Association**. All of which The Westmeath Show Society Ltd. is affiliated to.

N.B. Important Notice to animal Owners involved in Showing Animals From The Irish Shows Association.

The Irish Shows Association would advise all Animal owners who have their animals insured to have the Insurance cover extended to cover them while showing animals at shows, we understand that it costs very little or nothing at all depending on who you have insurance cover with.

The reason for us giving you this advice is that if your animal lashed out, and injured someone or damaged someone's property, and it is established that your animal was out of your control at that time, you may be held responsible or partly responsible for any injury or damage caused, you may end up paying all, or part of any settlement reached.

RIGHT OF ADMISSION RESERVED

CARE SHOULD BE TAKEN TO ENTER WORK IN CORRECT CLASS - Cancellation of Classes – The Committee reserve the right to cancel any class(es) due to insufficient entries.

The Show Committee in presenting this schedule for the 2024 show takes the opportunity of thanking all patrons of the Mullingar Show for their generous support, and hope that this year's schedule will meet the general approval of stock-breeders and householders alike.

It must be remembered by one and all that the success of the Show depends on the number of entries and members are invited to encourage interest in one or the other of the various classes. A

special invitation to take an active part in the Irish Countrywomen's Association, Macra na Feirme and the Irish Farmers Association. Every facility will be given to intending entrants, young and new entrants are especially welcome. As many as possible of the exhibits will be under cover and there is a spacious car park. We hope that you enjoy your day.

GENERAL RULES FOR IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIPS 2024

A Eligibility of Shows

Shows wishing to participate in the 2024 Championships and be eligible to hold qualifiers must have collected the Championship Fund Levy (currently 5%) from Horse, Pony, Cattle and Sheep class prize money for the year 2023 and forwarded the amount so collected, in full, to the Irish Shows Association Head Office within the stipulated period of not more than 30 days from the date of their show. Alternative methods of meeting this obligation are not acceptable.

Any show or competitor in breach of the Rules set out below will be disqualified from participating or competing in these championships.

These General Rules and those relating to individual championships (where applicable) should be published in the show schedule and catalogue of the participating show and must be strictly observed.

B Qualifying Rounds (Qualifiers)

Qualifying rounds will take place at eligible shows selected by the Irish Shows Association.

C Responsibility of shows holding qualifying rounds

- a. Selected shows should hold a separate class for each qualifier from which the highest placed animals will qualify.
- b. The qualifier class should be held as the first class in the relevant section of the show.
- c. Shows must ensure that the qualifiers are held strictly in accordance with the relevant rules.
- d. No other sponsor may be involved in qualifying classes.
- e. Shows may charge an entrance fee for each qualifying class. The I.S.A. will award a rosette to the successful animal(s) on appearance at the Final.
- f. No show hosting a Championship Final may hold a qualifier for that Championship on the day of the Final other than by agreement with the Irish Shows Association.
- g. Animals qualified for Finals are not eligible to enter in any other class at the Show where the Final is held other than a Qualifying Class for another Competition.
- Shows must appoint competent well-briefed persons to act as Stewards, who must ensure that only animals (or other exhibits) which are eligible to compete and those whose documentation is in order are allowed to proceed to the judging ring.
- i. Animal Passports must be read by a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the show.

- j. On completion of judging, Stewards must instruct the successful competitors to attend at the Show Secretary's Office within one hour and to complete the necessary documentation for entry to the championship final.
- The show must appoint a well-briefed officer, who will be in attendance at the Secretary's Office, and who will assist exhibitors to complete the necessary documentation for participation in the final and to collect the relevant entrance fee.
- I. Show Secretaries must forward complete result cards, together with appropriate fees to the ISA within three days following the holding of the show.

N.B - Shows must return results card marked "NO QUALIFIER" for any or all of the events for which no animal (or exhibit) has been selected.

D Responsibility of Exhibitors

- Exhibitors accept that the judges' decision is final in all cases. Any abuse of Judges will not be tolerated. Where a dispute or case for complaint arises the matter should only be dealt with under f. below.
- b. Winners of qualifiers are themselves responsible for entering their animals or exhibits for the final in accordance with *j. & k.* above, within one hour of qualifying.
- c. Winners of qualifiers will compete in the final.
- d. The I.S.A. in conjunction with the sponsor reserve the right to alter or amend the rules of any competition as may be necessary or appropriate.
- e. Shows and competitors must contact the National Irish Shows Office for details of any championships and not the sponsor involved.
- f. Objections must be lodged in writing with the I.S.A. representative at the show or the Show Secretary within half an hour following the completion of judging, together with a fee of €50.00, or other stated fee, which is refundable in the event of the objection being upheld.
- E Responsibilities of Shows Hosting Championship Final.
- a. A deduction of 5% of the prize money is to be collected by the Show and forwarded to the I.S.A. within 30 days of the final.
- b. Championship finals must start not later than 2.00.p.m. on the day of the show and the advertised time of starting must be adhered to as far as practicable, if necessary, other show classes should be either postponed or relocated to allow for this.

Notice of Interest to Championship Participants

Irish Law (EU Directive)

Under Irish Law, all horses moving from one location to another must be accompanied by their passports. It is in your own interest to ensure that this is the case. Failure to do so is

an offence under Irish law and is liable on summary conviction to result in a fine of up to €3,000.00. All passports must be registered with the name of the current owner.

- Embryo Transfer: Where a foal is produced by this method, the dam's passport must bear a
 declaration dated, stamped, and signed by the Stallion Owner (or accredited practitioner
 where Al is involved) stating the date on which the dam was last covered (or inseminated)
 and the name of the covering stallion.
- The owners of Champions and Reserve Champions are invited to submit the animals' passports to the ISA head office where the placing will be endorsed and officially stamped with the seal of the ISA as a permanent record.
- It is in the interest of shows hosting championship finals that photographs and results are forwarded to the Irish Farmers Journal immediately following judging.

ADDENDUM TO RULES OF HSI

Eligibility to compete in championships that are part of the HSI National Showing Championship series will be determined by HSI. In the event that an exhibit is subsequently found to be ineligible following selection at a qualifier they will be notified as soon as possible and the entry fee will be refunded.

Shows who hold qualifiers for Livestock may request exhibitors to enter the exhibit in at least one other class at their show on the day.

• From the Department of Agriculture & Food – Specific Requirements – Horses & other Equines.

Premises Registration

As from 1st May 2012, any premises (which includes shows, fairs & markets) where horses or other equines are gathered must be registered with the Department. Owners/persons in charge of such gatherings are required to submit a completed application form for registration and to keep records of movements on/off their premises.

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the Department for the purposes of tracing disease. Records required are:

Name & address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.

The premises registration number from which the equine came.

Passport number/UEL number of the animal.

It is important therefore that Show Organisers should contact their local District Veterinary Office in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined above.

Equine Identification

All Equines (which include horses, ponies & donkeys) must be identified in accordance with EU & national legislation.

Possession of an unidentified equine is an offence under the legislation. Passport must be issued by approved Passport Issuing Organisations (PIOs) within the calendar year of birth (by 31st December in the year of birth) or within six months of birth (whichever is later) and is valid for the lifetime of the animal.

Microchip – all equines issued with a passport after 1st July 2009 must have a corresponding microchip implanted by a veterinarian which is recorded in the passport & creates a link between the passport & the animal.

A Keeper must

Have an equine registered with a PIO

Have a passport issued in accordance with EU & national legislation Comply with the provisions of the legislation whereby a passport must accompany the equine whenever it is moved to events such as shows, sales and to slaughter plants etc.

• From the Department of Agriculture & Food – Specific Requirements – Cattle.

All animals must come from herds, which are not restricted, and the herd & relevant animals must have had a clear test within the previous twelve months. This test must be recorded on the Department's Animal Health Computer System (AHCS). No pre-movement test is required for T.B. However, it is recommended by the Department that a **30 day** pre-movement test for T.B. should apply to all shows.

AIM Notification:

The movement of cattle to and from an Agricultural Show within the State must be recorded on AIM. Keepers who plan to move animals to a Show must obtain a Certificate of Compliance prior to the movement of animals. No destination should be nominated when the keeper is applying for a Certificate.

At the Show, the Movement Notification section of the Certificate should be completed by the Keeper and the Show Secretary who should clearly indicate the Show Number on the form. Ultimate responsibility for fulfilling this requirement lies with the Show Secretary. Completed forms should be sent to the DVO in the County where the Show is being held within 7 days of the show.

Identification

All cattle must bear two plastic tags with the same number (one in each ear) as issued under the Department's identification system. They must be accompanied by their passports.

Specific Requirements – Sheep

Identification

All sheep must be individually identified with appropriate ear-tags issued in accordance with the requirements of the National Sheep Identification System.

Movement Documentation

All consignments of sheep being moved must be accompanied by a completed dispatch document. Individual details of each sheep in the consignment must be recorded. Sheep from non-restricted flocks ONLY can be moved to shows.

Flock Register

All movements of sheep to and from shows must be recorded in the keepers flock register. All sheep must be accompanied by a certification laid down in Directive 91/68/EEC as amended. Organisers are advised to contact their Local District Veterinary Office well in advance of any show where sales may take place to determine the suitability of the show for exports (e.g. premises and sheep status), availability of veterinary staff for export certification and to have the necessary arrangements out in place.

Attendance of sheep from scrapie monitored flocks at shows and sales in 2024.

Shows between 1st May and 31st October

Sheep from Scrapie Monitored Flocks will be permitted to attend agricultural shows taking place between 1st May & 31st October without restriction or separation from other categories of sheep.

For shows taking place before May 1st or after 31st October, sheep from scrapie monitored or probationary flocks must be separated from other sheep as follows:

- a. There must be complete separation of monitored/probationary sheep from other categories of sheep at the show. Ideally, this would mean a separate entrance and exit for each group, separate loading and unloading areas, separate penning areas for each of the two groups.
- b. In locations where all of the above may not be possible, the minimum requirement would be the separate loading and unloading and also of penning areas. The two areas should be separate by a sheep-free alleyway, at least 12 feet wide. If only one show-ring is available, the sheep from the scrapie-monitored flocks must be shown first.

NOTE --- Gazebos used in cattle section area not to be erected if it is windy or if wind is forecast. No helium balloons/children's water or pellet guns sold on grounds.

RIGHT TO REJECT OR CANCEL ANY ENTRY OR ENTRIES MADE BY OR ON BEHALF OF ANY PERSON, CORPORATE OR OTHER ENTITY AND MAY DIRECT THE REMOVAL OF ANY ANIMAL OR OTHER EXHIBIT FROM THE SHOWING RING OR DISPLAY AREA AND/OR FROM THE SHOWGROUNDS, IF THE COMMITTEE AND/OR ITS AGENTS/OFFICERS SHALL DEEM IT FIT TO DO SO, WITHOUT OFFERING ANY EXPLANATION OR REASON FOR DOING AND WITHOUT INCURRING ANY LIABILITY WHATSOEVER TO ANY SUCH APPLICANT/EXHIBITOR OR HIS/HER/ITS AGENT.

NOTE – WOULD THE PRESENT HOLDERS OF CUPS/TROPHIES/SHIELDS, PLEASE RETURN THEM IN GOOD CONDITION ON OR BEFORE SHOW DAY.

MESSAGE FROM THE IRISH SHOWS ASSOCIATION

DISCIPLINE

The Irish Shows Association expects and will insist upon appropriate behaviour from all Exhibitors and others participating in any of the activities at our Member Shows and will not tolerate inappropriate behaviour.

Inappropriate Behaviour shall include but not be limited to the following:

- Profanity, coarse or vulgar language or gestures towards judges or other Show officials.
- Harassment or bullying, including using words or actions that threaten, intimidate or undermine judges or other officials before, during or following Member Show activities.
- Failure to follow rules and/or obey instructions.
- Abusing any animal.

Disciplinary Procedures:

 Complaints of misconduct against an Exhibitor or other participant at a Member Show shall be investigated and adjudicated upon by a subcommittee appointed by the Irish Shows Association. The said subcommittee shall consist of three members of the board of the Irish Shows Association and shall be known as the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee shall seek to ensure the existence of consistent, effective, fair and transparent complaint procedures and shall act in accordance with natural and constitutional justice.

Procedure:

A complaint of misconduct/inappropriate behaviour against an Exhibitor or other participant in a Member Show shall be made in writing and delivered to the Secretary of the relevant Member Show within 72 hours.

A copy of the complaint shall be sent by the Secretary of the Member Show to the National Secretary of the ISA. A copy of the complaint will be sent by the National Secretary to the person or persons against whom the complaint is made. A person or persons against whom a written complaint is made shall have a period of 14 working days from the date of receipt of the claim to reply to the said complaint, such reply shall be made in writing.

SAFETY AT THE SHOW

Guidelines to note in relation to safety at the show

- Please observe signs especially those relating to caution in livestock areas
- Please do not exhibit animals that are unsuitable with regard to safety e.g. hard to control
- It is advisable for exhibitors to have their own Public Liability insurance to cover any eventuality
- All animals must be led by a competent handler
- Animals should not be tied to trailers/horse boxes or left unattended
- Dogs should be on a lead and under the control of the handler
- Caution and care should be exercised at all times
- All horses and ponies must be led
- All exercises must be inside the practice arena
- At all times all animals must be under strict control
- The public must stay outside the judging rings at all times and keep well clear of all animals
- Parents & those in charge of young children should keep them under close supervision & take particular care at all times
- Please keep all entrances & exits FREE at all times to facilitate Ambulances

Premises Registration

(This rule does not apply in Northern Ireland).

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the Department for the purposes of tracing disease.

RECORDS REQUIRED ARE:

- The name and address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.
- Premises registration number from which the Equine came.
- Passport number/UEL number of the animal.
- It is important therefore that Show Organisers should contact their local District Veterinary Office in advance so that consideration can be given to compliance with the requirements outlined above.

Owners/persons in charge of such gatherings are required to submit a completed application form for registration and to keep records of movements on/off their premises.

Records must be retained for at least 3 years as they may be required by the Department for the purposes of tracing disease.

RECORDS REQUIRED ARE:

- The name and address of the owner/person in charge of the premises from which the equine came.
- Premises registration number from which the Equine came.
- Passport number/UEL number of the animal.

Notice From Department of Agriculture Food & The Marine

Specific Requirements – Cattle

The following changes are being introduced for keepers of bovine animals who wish to show cattle.

Keepers of cattle are now required to obtain a Certificate of Compliance prior to the movement of an animal to a Show.

Certificates of Compliance can be obtained online from the Animal Identification and Movement (AIM) system through the <u>www.agfood.ie</u> facility or from the Cattle Movement Notification Agency.

When applying for a Certificate of Compliance, keepers should not specify a destination herd.

On the day of the Show, the Certificate of Compliance should be presented to the Show Secretary along with the bovine passport for the animal.

The Keeper & the Show Secretary will then sign the Movement Notification section of the Certificate which will then be sent to the local DVO for recording onto the AIM system

Please note that only cattle for which a valid Certificate of Compliance is provided to the Show Secretary will be allowed to be shown on the day of the Show.

These Certificates will replace the previously used CMMS 4 forms.
